

Inpatient occupational therapy program objectives.

- 1. To provide a comprehensive program within a rehabilitation setting that utilizes a team approach to maximize an individual's independent functioning and participation in daily life activities.
- 2. To develop, restore, or improve required skills, habits, and roles for independent, meaningful, and productive living.
- 3. To provide assessment and treatment of occupational performance in the areas of independent living/daily living skills, pre-vocational/work adjustment skills, play/leisure skills, and social skills.
- 4. To provide assessment and treatment of performance components including neuromuscular, sensory integration, cognitive, and psychosocial skills.
- 5. To provide assessment and treatment in the areas of therapeutic adaptations including orthotics/prosthetics and assistive/adaptive equipment.
- 6. To provide assessment, treatment, and education in the area of prevention in order to minimize debilitation.
- 7. To participate in patient and family education programs and provide them with the necessary information and resources for independent living.
- 8. To participate in interdisciplinary and individual research activities.
- 9. To participate in continuing education, training and self-study to assure competent Occupational Therapy services.
- 10. To participate in the education of society, consumers of health services, legislators, and other health care providers on matters within the purview of Occupational Therapy.
- 11. To evaluate, develop, and refine services, the body of knowledge, and the skills which underlie the practice of Occupational Therapy.
- 12. To provide state of the art and quality Occupational Therapy services within a system that recognizes the need for cost containment and productivity.
- 13. To participate in quality assurance and program evaluation to assure competent Occupational Therapy services.
- 14. To function as a consistent cooperative member of the interdisciplinary team of the National Rehabilitation Hospital, and to ensure the maintenance of the approach in the delivery of the patient care activities.
- 15. To conduct all activities of the Occupational Therapy Service in accordance with legal and professional standards established for certification, accreditation, protection of patients, and professional staff rights.
- 16. To abide by the Principles of Occupational Therapy Ethics of the American Occupational Therapy Association.
